Pulpit Supply Profiles – Pastor Eric Sabbatical 2022

Rev. Franz Rigert served as pastor to Pilgrim UCC in Grafton for nearly 20 years until he was called by the Wisconsin Conference of the United Church of Christ to serve as Conference Minister. (2/13)

Rev. Sharon Stier is a recently retired pastor who served congregations in Illinois and Southeastern Wisconsin. Worship leadership, Christian Education, Youth, Family Life, Pastoral Care and Mission ministries were included in her work with these churches. She also serves as Secretary of the Board of Directors of Habitat for Humanity of Washington and Dodge Counties. (2/20, 3/2, 4/10)

Rev. Julie Jennings is the current Vice President of Spiritual Care and Wellbeing at Cedar Community in West Bend. Rev. Jennings previously served as the Chaplain at Every Child's Hope in St. Louis, MO, which is dedicated to preventing child abuse, treating emotional trauma and mental health issues, and providing aftercare and follow-up services. Rev. Kim Henning served as the beloved head pastor at Grace Congregational UCC in Two Rivers for over 33 years until his retirement in August 2021. (3/13, 5/1)

Rev. Jim Schleif served in the Navy and had a 28-year career in commercial nuclear power before pursuing a true sense of calling to ministry. He served as pastor at St. John's UCC in Hartford and Slinger. Rev. Schleif currently serves at the UCCI (United Church Camps Inc.) Director of Ministry and Site Operations. (3/20, 4/24, 5/22)

Rev. Andrew Warner serves as Director of Development for the Wisconsin Conference of the UCC. Before joining the conference staff in 2019, Andrew served for 22 years as pastor of Plymouth UCC of Milwaukee. Andrew also serves as a Generosity Outreach Officer of the national setting of the UCC. Rev. Dr. Julie Mavity Maddalena, is the Chaplin at Lakeland University in Sheboygan County. Dr. Mavity Maddalena also serves as the Ethicist in Residence, Director of the Ulrich Center and is an Assistant Professor of Philosophy and Religion at Lakeland. (4/3, 5/15)

Rev. Russ Knoth is a retired Pastor of the United Church of Christ. Rev. Knoth also serves as the volunteer Police Chaplain to the Menomonee Police and Fire Department since 1989. Rev. Knoth, a member of Peace Church, serves as a frequent visiting minister to Peace UCC. (4/14, 4/15, 4/17, 6/5)

<u>Chaplain, Rev. Emma Landowski-Sancomb</u>, a former Kewaskum resident, served as the Resident Chaplain at SSM Health Saint Louis University Hospital until she recently accepted the position of Chaplain at Ascension. (5/8, 5/29)

Mirebalais, Haiti Honors Heidi Thomas - Heidi Thomas, Peace Church member who



passed away in November of 2020, has been honored in the town of Mirebalais, Haiti with a memorial in the town square. This was funded by donations to VIP (Ventures in People) for use in building this memorial.

Heidi was involved in Haiti with Ventures In People Foundation Inc., for 32 years. She and her husband Roland, were among the group of people who went to Haiti in 1981, saw the need, and were instrumental in laying the groundwork for what we know today as the Ventures In People Foundation. In those early days, health care was a primary need in the central plateau of Haiti and Heidi with her nursing degree was a natural and her skills were a plus. Through the years Heidi was a strong advocate for the Haitians and the work of the VIP board, and has given countless presentations presenting the needs and programs based on the needs of the Haitians. She was successful in soliciting grants from service organizations for the VIP board's work. She was the leader of many work groups to Haiti often going more than once a year. If she found

someone interested in Haiti, she would immediately organize a group and go South. There was no task that was too difficult for Heidi. She saw the focus of the board's growth from a sole concern to an organization that today includes 4-H Clubs, a Goat Project, and Education Project and a Clean Water Project.
