From the Pastor's Vikar's Study

As the plane descended gently into the Milwaukee area, an evening light of pure orange streams through the windows, pouring into this flying tin can like a liquid, filling not just eyes, but souls with the waning Sun's light that speaks of both a welcoming and even a certain amount of melancholy.

"Wherever you are on life's journey, you are welcome here" – it is among the words and impressions that led me here to this congregation, words that Pastor Eric uses every Sunday and on other occasions. And yet, those words also prompt the question: Where am I on life's journey? Nobody really knows how much of our present is truly a beginning, or if we're right in the middle of it all, or if, indeed, we are writing on our closing chapters.

In most respects I feel like I'm experiencing a new beginning. In recent weeks I stripped myself of all my possessions, put everything that was left in storage in one of our old parsonages (we have a lot of those around), sold the car, ate the remaining supplies, until I was just a body with clothes on, plus a big suitcase with some additional attire and all the devices we rely on in this time and age.

I left the place that I called home for the last two and a half years with the words of Scripture in mind, "The Lord said to Jacob: I am with you and will watch over you wherever you go," (Genesis 28:15) encouraging me that I was, in fact, not alone, but that it would be the same God that sent me off on that late afternoon in

Germany which would keep me over "wide space" (Psalm 31:8) and greet me anew in the orange light above Wisconsin.

Still, traveling like this is always an existential experience, especially if you're on your own. It is almost like a little death: at the end, you face the transition alone, and you don't really know what awaits you on the other side. In this case I got lucky and was greeted by Eric and Laura's friendly faces, a warm hug, and a hearty meal at Red Robin's. It would become the first of many culinary excursions I was happily exposed to in just the first 10 days of my being here, erasing that European prejudice that Americans don't know what "real food" is. Of course, since I had spent longer periods of time abroad before, especially in Israel and Italy, I already had little regard for assumptions like that.

The warm hug in a figurative sense kept embracing me as soon as I started to meet all the new people in the congregation and as I continue to learn new faces and names every day, including at Cedar Ridge where I moved into my apartment. I can only say that I am grateful for all the welcoming smiles and words of encouragement – each of them contributed to a sense of belonging that – in my case – always followed the sentiment of "blossom where you're planted". Home and family can both have more meanings than just one, and I've always held the conviction that you can find those anywhere you put up your tent.

Well, the tent is up and I'm ready to go out into this exciting new year with you all! We'll see what awaits us on the way – for me it will be a path of learning, but also full of places where I can hopefully give back, help out, and share the burdens any congregation has to bear in the joint call that we all follow – of which pastoral ministry is really just one part. And all those amazing experiences waiting around the corner will also round out my own journey into ministry, the final steps before receiving ordination back home next year.

I'm thankful to all of you at Peace UCC for letting me be part of your life's journey for the upcoming months – every day a gift from the One who carefully brought us into this world, who keeps us, feeds us, and nurtures our growth always. May God bless us,

Peace United Church of Christ Scholarship Fund

The purpose of the Scholarship Fund is to give financial aid and recognition to members of this Church who have shown significant academic and other constructive accomplishment in their school career and church participation.

All members of the Church who, in the opinion of the Committee are qualified and worthy recipients based upon the following criteria are eligible to receive a scholarship:

- Academic achievement
- Service to the Church
- Christian character
- Educational aims

Members may re-apply annually. Applicants may request aid toward the education of their choice beyond High School.

Application forms are available in the Church office or on our website. Applications must be received by **AUGUST 1, 2023.**

Notification of scholarship awards will be made by July 1. Amounts will vary annually. Applicants selected to receive a scholarship shall be expected to remain in continuous attendance in school for the entire semester. Applicants must submit a transcript of their grades ASAP before February 1, 2024, following the completion of the first semester, in order to receive their scholarship. Applicants must have successfully completed 12 credits, (full-time student) with no less than a 2.0 grade point average (based on a 4.0 scale).
