Silence for Meditation

Leader: May our prayers rise up before you O God.

Christ calls to us, inviting us to raise up our hearts and prayers to him.

All: We lift them that we may be made whole. We recommit our lives to God, confessing our brokenness, and asking God for strength. Transform us O God - guide us in more fully and more humbly knowing your love.

Old Testament Lesson Joel 2:1, 12-13

Blow the horn in Zion; give a shout on my holy mountain! Let all the people of the land tremble, for the day of the Lord is coming. It is near—

Yet even now, says the LORD, return to me with all your heart, with fasting, with weeping, and with mourning; tear your hearts and not your clothing. Return to the LORD, your God, for he is merciful and compassionate, very patient, full of faithful love, and ready to forgive.

Responsive Psalm Psalm 51:1-15

Have mercy on me, God, according to your faithful love! Wipe away my wrongdoings according to your great compassion!

Wash me completely clean of my guilt; purify me from my sin!

Because I know my wrongdoings, my sin is always right in front of me.

I've sinned against you—you alone. I've committed evil in your sight.

That's why you are justified when you render your verdict, completely correct when you issue your judgment.

Yes, I was born in guilt, in sin, from the moment my mother conceived me.

And yes, you want truth in the most hidden places; you teach me wisdom in the most secret space.

Purify me with hyssop and I will be clean; wash me and I will be whiter than snow.

Let me hear joy and celebration again; let the bones you crushed rejoice once more.

Hide your face from my sins; wipe away all my guilty deeds!

Create a clean heart for me, God; put a new, faithful spirit deep inside me!

Please don't throw me out of your presence; please don't take your holy spirit away from me.

Return the joy of your salvation to me and sustain me with a willing spirit.

Then I will teach wrongdoers your ways, and sinners will come back to you.

Deliver me from violence, God, God of my salvation, so that my tongue can sing of your righteousness.

Lord, open my lips, and my mouth will proclaim your praise.

The Gospel of Matthew 6:1–21 (CEB)

- 6 "Be careful that you don't practice your religion in front of people to draw their attention. If you do, you will have no reward from your Father who is in heaven.
- ² "Whenever you give to the poor, don't blow your trumpet as the hypocrites do in the synagogues and in the streets so that they may get praise from people. I assure you, that's the only reward they'll get. ³ But when you give to the poor, don't let your left hand know what your right hand is doing ⁴ so that you may give to the poor in secret. Your Father who sees what you do in secret will reward you.
- ⁵ "When you pray, don't be like hypocrites. They love to pray standing in the synagogues and on the street corners so that people will see them. I assure you, that's the only reward they'll get. ⁶ But when you pray, go to your room, shut the door, and pray to your Father who is present in that secret place. Your Father who sees what you do in secret will reward you.
- ⁷ "When you pray, don't pour out a flood of empty words, as the Gentiles do. They think that by saying many words they'll be heard. ⁸ Don't be like them, because your Father knows what you need before you ask. ⁹ Pray like this:

Our Father who is in heaven, uphold the holiness of your name.

10 Bring in your kingdom so that your will is done on earth as it's done in heaven.

¹¹ Give us the bread we need for today.

¹² Forgive us for the ways we have wronged you, just as we also forgive those who have wronged us.

¹³ And don't lead us into temptation, but rescue us from the evil one.

¹⁴ "If you forgive others their sins, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. ¹⁵ But if you don't forgive others, neither will your Father forgive your sins.

¹⁶ "And when you fast, don't put on a sad face like the hypocrites. They distort their faces so people will know they are fasting. I assure you that they have their reward. ¹⁷ When you fast, brush your hair and wash your face. ¹⁸ Then you won't look like you are fasting to people, but only to your Father who is present in that secret place. Your Father who sees in secret will reward you.

¹⁹ "Stop collecting treasures for your own benefit on earth, where moth and rust eat them and where thieves break in and steal them. ²⁰ Instead, collect treasures for yourselves in heaven, where moth and rust don't eat them and where thieves don't break in and steal them. ²¹ Where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.

Leader: Let us pray.

ourselves. We do not forgive others as we have

been forgiven.

People: Have mercy on us, O God.

Leader: We are deaf to your call to serve as Christ served

us. We fail to be true to the ways and thoughts of

Christ.

People: Have mercy on us, O God.

Leader: We confess to you, O God, all our past

unfaithfulness - our pride, and our judgment of others, our impatience, and self-indulgence in our

lives,

People: Have mercy on us, O God.

Leader: We fail to offer our lives as a living sacrifice to you;

we exploit ourselves and others,

People: Have mercy on us, O God.

Leader: For all our stubborn certainties which lead us to seek

easy or comfortable ways instead of your ways.

People: Have mercy on us, O God.

Leader: For our angers and frustrations, for the ways that we

fail to let our daily life reflect your ways.

People: Have mercy on us, O God.

Leader: For our negligence in prayer and worship and our

failure to nurture the faith that you place within us,

People: Have mercy on us, O God.

Leader: Merciful God, accept our repentance for the wrongs

we have done; for our neglect of human need and suffering, for our indifference to injustice and cruelty,

People: Accept our repentance, O God.

Leader: Restore us, O God, and let your anger depart from

us.

People: Hear us, O God, for your mercy is great.

Preparing the Ashes - Humbling our Hearts Before God

As we consider our own need for repentance, our own brokenness in the face of God's grace, we recall the words of Genesis 3:19: And God said to Adam: "By the sweat of your face you shall eat your food until you return to the ground, for out of it you were taken; you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Lord have mercy upon us. We are dust and to dust we shall return. Restore us O God to your mercy. Cleanse our hearts.

The Imposition of Ashes

We invite people to process, masked, maintaining appropriate social distance from those not in their "bubble." Ashes will be offered to all those who wish them.

We receive ashes as an act of confession, and as a physical sign and reminder of our mortality and penitence.

Leader: May our prayers come before you, O God, as incense, and may your presence surround and fill us, so that in union with all of creation, we might sing your praise and your love in our lives.

All: Amen.
