From the Pastor's Study • December 2023/January 2024

I heard the other day that social media was lifting up the amazing phenomena that this year December has five Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays. Some social media posts proclaimed that this occurs just once every 823 years and the Chinese even call the phenomena "bag full of money". What a fun piece of trivia. I even shared this word with someone else after looking at the calendar and thinking, "cool, five weekends in December." I have to say that I was a little sad when I sat down to write this reflection, only to find that this wondrous trivia was just another of those ubiquitous urban myths... I'm always delighted by observations that encourage us to see the world a little differently, even if only for an instant. I know that it's what continues to intrigue me in the study of scripture – I hold a deep longing to see and understand the world in new ways. The world steadily invites us to catch reflections of God's vision of a life that really is life. So, these unexpected glimpses encourage us to read our relationship to the world differently, more faithfully, with a greater spiritual challenge.

Thanksgiving and Christmas are quickly approaching. Almost every year there emerges some new insight or understanding related to how we tell these familiar stories. Some of the stories we have always been told might fall in that same realm of urban myth. We pray that the new glimpses we

learn encourage us to keep deepening our understanding of our history, our world, and our relationship with God. Thanksgiving is a much more complicated holiday when we listen to our history held alongside that of Indigenous Peoples. The Christmas story becomes full of fresh insight and revolutionary political critique when read through the histories and lenses of first century Palestinian-Jews living under Roman occupation. How do we see our stories through fresh eyes? That's the invitation of our Advent journey each year.

In this year of celebrating the journey of Peace UCC, I looked back at my first Christmas Tidings article and found a similar theme:

December 1998

We are about to once again enter the Advent season. In this season, time is our blessed gift. As people of faith, this is our time to prepare ourselves for the unexpected miracle of God appearing in our world in extraordinary ways. This is a time to put all of our assumptions on hold and really carefully watch and listen. We watch so that we might see the word and listen so that we just might hear the light.

We are continually on a journey of faith. So often when we all pile into our cars to go on physical journeys there is someone asking the question "are we there yet?" I remember taking trips with my Granddad when I was a boy. He loved to watch everything as we drove along. This didn't necessarily aid his driving, but wow, how it opened up the world! I always loved traveling with him, his pointing out the color of a field or the shape of a cloud or some other detail that I might have missed. Traveling with Granddad wasn't about arriving - "being there yet" - it was about watching all the details along the way.

In a world that tries to force us to arrive at Christmas before we are there, it's a very real challenge to pause and savor the journey. For the next few weeks, we watch the sky and look for a star, maybe this time... maybe, just maybe again. We watch the people around us and see how God is breaking into our world through the kind word of another, through a small child or through the wise eyes of someone at the other end of life. Take the time to open your senses, to open them in unexpected ways, see with your heart, hear with your eyes, taste with your ears...

The wonder of the season isn't social media-professed trivia, but rather the invitation to hear how God chooses to be made known in the world by radically reorienting our ways. Jesus' birth once turned the world upside down in its understanding of God's ways by challenging the way people understood what real power looks like: the power of unbounded grace and justice for the least, the last, and the lost. We still long for the light of God to break into the world and turn our attention toward all that would illuminate our souls. I hope that we might take the time again to delight in rediscovering God's story hiding all around us.

The meeting opened at 6:00pm with a prayer from Vikar Jakob.

Motion to approve the agenda Clark P, with a second from Paul B. Motion carried.

Motion to approve the September minutes made by Mark B, second from Lisa A. Motion carried.

Opening prayer: Approval of Agenda (a) Motion: Second: Motion approved.

Approval of Minutes from prior month Motion: Second: Minutes approved.

Financial report presented by Cathy Stern. Motion made by Clark P. to place the financial report on file for audit, with a 2nd coming from Vance R. Motion approved.

- Nominees for council several people are asking for nominees. Will continue asking people if they would serve in 2024.
- Annual meeting
