From the Pastor's Study • February 2023

"Unless the LORD builds the house, the builders labor in vain." (Psalm 127:1, NIV)

We've written that verse so often on the walls of homes that we have built with Habitat for Humanity. I've just returned from a Habitat trip to Winston-Salem, North Carolina. It was the first trip that we've managed to send forth since just before the pandemic. It felt really good to once again be engaged in this ministry that has had so much importance to our congregation for so long. As we struggled to get three young adults who were able to join us for the week, we were quickly remembering the trips when youth, young adult, and adult teams would each go out with a dozen instead of a handful. It's easy to look back at some time gone by and wistfully remember and become distracted from seeing how our God is a God who is active yesterday, today, and tomorrow. Our little group was amazing: in the work they did, in the witness that they offered to those around them, in the ways that they cared for one another as a model of beloved community. The experience was that longed-for reminder that God is at work in the here and now with the tools and people at hand. It's the reminder to keep refocusing on how God is at work in this moment. That is and has always been the work of God's faithful, and it's often been hard work. I think of the Israelites in the wilderness complaining about what they'd left behind in Egypt – garlic, flesh-pots – somehow forgetting the part of the story that they were also stuck in a reality of slavery that was less than desirable.

We are invited to be laborers with this God all the time. We are reminded to look at the work we are doing and to ask how it is that we see God at work guiding the ministries in which we engage. Since the last newsletter, we've begun our monthly free community meals with some indication that momentum may grow. We've heard from members of the congregation celebrating the chance to gather and we've watched as new faces from the community have come in to find the love of God freely shared in food, hospitality, spirit. We saw familiar faces return for the holidays, even as we grieved not seeing others whose presence we've longed for. We've encountered blessings and God's mercy revealing itself among us in so many different ways. The path forward never seems to be quite what we'd expect, but it's good.

When last I wrote, I was sharing about our German exchange pastor joining us at the beginning of the year. Well, as yet another reminder of our strained immigration system, we are now hoping that all of the hurdles for his visa will have been cleared for him to be able to arrive at the beginning of March. Once he joins us, we will have the blessing of sharing in ministry with him for 12 months. I would have hoped that the time had already begun... but God is also in the waiting, and God will be in the arriving.

Soon we will reenter the season of Lent. We'll turn again to Holden Evening Prayer, but now with an added personal connection of having Berit working at Holden Village for the year. As we gather for Ash Wednesday, Laura and I will have just returned from that retreat community in the Cascade mountains with new visions of the place that birthed this beloved musical setting of vespers. As we continue through Lent we'll be hearing from this year's confirmands with their insights and wisdom. At each step along the way we are invited to pause and look for where God is leading us. And we are to remember that the path isn't supposed to be merely of our own creation but rather the one which God is building, for otherwise it will all be in vain. May God bless us each in celebrating this day and all that God is doing with us and through us. Shalom,

<u>2023 Canada Wilderness Canoe Trip</u> - This coming August, Peace Church will be heading north again to the Canadian wilderness for a time of interaction with some of the very best of God's creation - the sparkling clean waters and forestlands of the White Otter Wilderness area in Ontario. Our trip will take place August 12 (leave Kewaskum early that morning), be on the water Aug. 13-17, and drive back to Kewaskum on Friday Aug. 18.

Approx. cost for the trip will be between \$450 - \$550 depending on our final trip itinerary, number of participants and any fundraisers we might do between now and the trip. All you need to bring with you are your clothes, personal items, and a willingness to participate in a new adventure!!

December 13, 2022

Meeting opened at 6:36 pm with a prayer offered by Brad Preder.

Motion from Melissa P and 2nd from Paul B to approve the agenda. Motion carried.

Motion to approve the November minutes by Mark B with a 2nd from Tom K. Motion carried.

Financial report provided by Tom Kolb. Pick up of \$10k to the general fund for the month of Nov and anticipating another nice increase in Dec. Motion made by Melissa P to file the treasurer's report with a second from Vance R. Motion carried.

Old Business:

- 1. Hoping to have an updated draft of the Constitution for the Jan meeting, so that future Consistory comments can be gathered.
- 2. Jakob's visa is still pending immigration approval. All Church documents were provided the week after Thanksgiving. Housing will be provided by Cedar Ridge at no charge. In return he will be asked to speak and be present in that community. Jerry O'Connor is heading up the apartment review to determine what else will be required prior to his arrival. Still looking through vehicle options and how to insure.
- 3. John Lemke reviewed the updated investment policy changes. Main change is the requirement of the investment committee to make one of two suggestions on where to apply any gains to the Consistory at year end. Motion from committee to approve the changes. 1 abstain, and the rest was yes. Motion carried.

- 4. Kathy talked about ushering, coffee hour, etc for 2023. At this time her and Brad will be collaborating to make recommendations. Jan 1, 9:30am service only. Ushers will be Clark, Paul, Mark and Kathy.
- 5. Kathy spoke about stewardship moments. Looking at having people present to the Congregation for 2-3 minutes.
- 6. Kathy asked for recommendations on a visual for the general fund giving. John L to donate 2 display boards that potentially could be used for this effort. Marnie will work with Kathy.
- 7. Kathy requested that we think about donating future holiday income to the Community Meal.

Church Event Review:

- 1. Pancake breakfast took in \$1100
- 2. Intergenerational supper/cookie decorating decorated over 200 cookies with 20 participants.
- 3. \$130 in good will donations at the Community meal. Approximately 40 people attended. Of that 6 people from outside the church attended. Some in need and some for community building. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed.
- 4. Children's Christmas program was a success. Special thanks to Kathy and Mugs McFadden and all those involved in making this a nice program. Kathy got 3 mom's to agree help with next year's program.
- 5. Consistory meetings will start at 6pm starting in 2023.
- 6. Will vote for Consistory VP and secretary at the Jan meeting.
- 7. Trustee report written by Karen K and presented by Clark. Anonymous donation of \$10,000 made towards the kitchen fund and is greatly appreciated. Roger and Kathy Mertz donated the kitchen microwave. John Kletti, Roger Mertz, Howard Zemlicka, Emil Radetzky, Bill Becker, Karen Kletti and Pastor Eric donated time to fix the church sign and planter as well as various things in the kitchen. Many thanks to all!
- 8. Paul B presented an update on the Church cemetery project. Picture of the cemetery sign reviewed. Motion from committee to approve art for church cemetery. 1 No, with the rest yes. Motion carried. Discussion held on the columbarium. Looking to understand the cost/capacity. May lose 16 grave sites to have this structure.
- 9. 6 applicants applied for the janitor position. Personnel committee to start interviewing candidates. Both internal and external candidates applied.
- 10. Pastor Eric submitted his report. One member asked to transfer out and 2 transferred in from another church.
- 11. John Lemke passed out a printout containing his reflections from the past 6 years of serving and spoke to some important aspects.
- 12. Special thanks to the members who have finished their terms: John Lemke, Tom Kolb and Karen Kletti. Your time and talents are so appreciated!!
