From the Pastor's Study • June & July 2023

A week ago, Laura and I left the house to visit family in Iowa and there were buds on our trees. As we were out and about, we noted elsewhere that the leaves were already out on the trees along our drive only to return home to find our trees leafed out and shading the yard. I love the changes of spring! Things keep blooming and growing, transforming the world around us in trickles and in bursts. I don't tend to be someone who likes change for changes sake, but nature itself reminds me that life is constantly changing and that when we open our eyes to see and embrace that change, we might just catch a glimpse of wonder.

The other day Steve Garnaas-Holmes shared a story in his daily reflection "unfolding light" that captured my imagination in this season:

"A girl in my high school that I never knew but saw a lot used to go around every corner in the hallway as if she'd never been there before. She'd lean way out to the side to look, almost on one foot, the other stretched behind, as if to see it for the first time, as if to check it out before she committed to making the turn. But she always made the turn. It wasn't fearful, just a pause, a moment of expectation. "Look," she told herself, "I'm turning a corner!" I loved it. Whenever I saw her do it I'd walk into my next classroom with a little bit of anticipation, even under pretense, a little expectation that I might be surprised. Or I might actually turn a corner and actually do something for the first time. And I often surprised myself. I looked as if for the first time, and often saw something for the first time. Or saw somebody I'd seen a thousand times as if for the first time. I still love her for it.

What a beautiful image of engaging every turn in life with curiosity and even excitement. I am humbled to imagine moving forward as a church with that spirit. Everything that we read and learn about the church reminds us that there are changes before us. I heard last week that the church is declining as a percentage of population in every corner of the world. And yet (and yet!), there is always faith that we are a tradition that celebrates resurrection even after what we perceive as death and decay. As I keep sharing, we are in a moment in time when it is unclear what that future might look like. So, I choose to trust, because I'd rather turn every corner with curiosity and anticipation than wring my hands in fear. That's hard to do when finances are challenging, when our world can impose the weary burdens of uncertainty, and when anxiety is used as a tool to push particular agendas. How can we sing a different song in our lives, one that fills pauses with expectation, that looks to celebrate the surprises? This summer, part of this effort to see anew will be to reclaim some things we've done before. We will once again have a Habitat Trip, but with an even more intergenerational team. We'll return to Canada canoeing, this time sharing the experience with many who have never been with us before. We will look to see through new eyes in each of those settings. At Peace Church, we will be shifting our worship times and services for the summer season. We've talked about trying this for years, so this year we will have one worship service at 9:00 a.m. on Sunday mornings. We may be blessed with fuller feeling services through this little change of pace, and we certainly will lean into a season where we all come together without the question of "what service do you go to?" Maybe, this experience will offer a chance to worship with friends and family who have been at "the other service" for years.

I hope that we can all approach the change with the open spirit of wonder. At the same time, we are working to pull together a midweek service that will take on a very different form from Sunday mornings. The hope is to have a space that engages our journeys of faith a little differently than what we've always done: more interaction, less formality, a gathering to try to listen in one more way that God is leading us. There will be more information about this soon.

We keep trying to pay attention to how our still-speaking God is leading us into a future yet unknown. My prayer is that each of us would tell our story: celebrate the corners of the past where we were surprised with wonder; and peek around the corners ahead trying to imagine what ministry is still unfolding among us.

May God bless us with surprises and insights that feed our souls and inspire us to steward the love of God into the world in ever expanding ways!

Peace United Church of Christ Scholarship Fund

The purpose of the Scholarship Fund is to give financial aid and recognition to members of this Church who have shown significant academic and other constructive accomplishments in their school career and church participation.

All members of the Church who, in the opinion of the Committee are qualified and worthy recipients based upon the following criteria are eligible to receive a scholarship:

- Academic achievement
- Service to the Church
- Christian character
- Educational aims

Members may re-apply annually. Applicants may request aid toward the education of their choice beyond High School.

Application forms are available in the Church office or on our website. Applications must be received by **AUGUST 1, 2023.**

Notification of scholarship awards will be made by July 1. The amounts will vary annually. Applicants selected to receive a scholarship shall be expected to remain in continuous attendance in school for the entire semester. **Applicants must submit a transcript of their grades ASAP before February 1, 2024,** following the completion of the first semester, in order to receive their scholarship. Applicants must have successfully completed 12 credits, (full-time student) with no less than a 2.0 grade point average (based on a 4.0 scale).

<u>Pastoral Relations Survey</u> - The annual evaluation of Pastor Eric will take place during the month of June. The evaluation was skipped last year because Pastor Eric was away on Sabbatical for 4 months. We will have surveys for church members to fill out anonymously (or signed) at 3 locations in church - the pick-up of blank forms and drop-off of filled out forms will be available in the Narthex, by the Elevator entrance in the Sanctuary, and in the entry area coming in from the Parking Lot. People can pick

them up from one of these 3 locations, take them home and then return them to one of these locations and put their filled-out form in the drop-off slot in the boxes. These boxes and the forms will be in place on Sunday, June 4th and will remain in place throughout the month of June. The Pastoral Relations team will go through the returned forms and tally up the results at our August 21st meeting.

<u>Habitat for Humanity Trip – July 9th-14th</u> This year we are planning an intergenerational Habitat Trip to Red Wing Minnesota. Anyone who has completed their freshman year in high school or beyond (even well beyond) is welcome to come and lend a hand in seeking to provide decent housing for all of God's children. The affiliate is asking for a minimum of 7 people, but we are hoping for many more than that. The cost will be \$75 for members or \$100 for non-members. If you have questions please contact Karen Kletti, Clark Pearson, or Pastor Eric. **There will be a meeting for those who are interested in taking this trip on Thursday, June 14th at 6:30 p.m. to discuss the trip.**

April 11, 2023, Consistory Meeting Minutes

Meeting opened by Kathy C with prayer led by Mark B at 6:00 pm.

Motion to approve the agenda with changes to add Open and Affirming by Chris R, with a second from Kathy C. Motion carried.

Motion by Kathy to approve the March minutes with changes (Melinda S present and Melissa P absent). Second made by Paul B. Motion carried.

Financial report provided by Ken S. Motion made by Clark P to place the report on file for audit, with a second from Mark B. Motion carried.

Pastor's report submitted for review.

Review of further proposed constitution changes that will be presented to the Congregation on May 7th. A question came up regarding whether consistory members should be part of the Pastoral relations committee. Currently members are filling the open positions, and we are trying to engage others to fill those spots in the future. Clark P made a motion to pay off the remaining balance of the Cornerstone loan (approximately \$53,000) with our current memorial fund investments to avoid paying the increasing interest rate. Second made by Mark B. Motion carried.

Mark B presented the endowment policy updates that were made by the endowment committee. Motion from the endowment committee to approve the updated policy and to present the updated policy to the congregation for formal approval on May 7, 2023. Discussion held along with a review of the old policy and the new proposal. Motion carried.

OCWM giving was talked about and Rev Andrew Warner will speak to those interested in learning more about OCWM giving on June 4.

Kathy presented a Project sheet that could be initiated when suggestions for activities etc are generated.

Kathy spoke to us about the Thank You bulletin board. All are encouraged to please write up a thank you anytime you recognize the opportunity.

Motion by Mark B to update the camp scholarship amounts to \$100 for a partial week camp and \$200 for a full week camp. Second by Clark P. Motion carried. Will review to confirm whether a policy exists. If so, that will be updated.

Kathy is looking for members to be on a stewardship team. Clark P volunteered. Kathy will reach out to others who may be interested.

Communion by Intinction takes place on April 16 for confirmation. Lisa A. Melinda S, and Chris R will be available to help with communion. Tim S, Paul B, and Kathy C will assist with communion on May 7th at 8. Melissa P, Mark B, Lisa A, Kathy M, Melinda S and Becky M to assist with communion on May 7th at 9:30.

Kathy spoke to what a beautiful week of services were provided by the music and pastoral teams. Many thanks to all those involved. Chris R thanked Rev Jakob and Pastor Eric for working together so beautifully and leading such moving services.
