From the Pastor's Study • May 2023

My college friends have been sending photos the last couple of weeks as they watch for signs of spring. In Minneapolis it was the snow finally melting again off the table on the patio allowing it to emerge from its rounded winter mound. In Chicagoland it was the daffodils pushing their leaves up through last year's dead leaves. And then here this week, the world seems to have exploded with crocus and daffodils, sunshine, and birdsong. What a glorious unfolding of the Easter proclamation. I know that scientists can explain how plants know when it's time to push through the snow, or these early flowers know when to bloom... for me, I'm content to receive their witness as wonder and inspiration.

The Gospel for the second Sunday of Easter always has the followers of Jesus gathered in a room behind locked doors for fear of those whom they have challenged. In their days it was the religious leaders who were frightened by how Jesus' popular message had attracted so much attention and so many people. They were concerned that this message of love and grace might upset the status quo. They might lose the fragile arrangement that they had with the Roman empire that allowed them to maintain the Temple and continue to practice their religion. Fear can be a powerful paralyzing force. Into that uncertainty Jesus speaks words of blessing, he breathes his spirit upon them and tells them that they, too, are sent into the world. It's an idea that most of us know well as a part of our faith, that we are to share God's love with the world. But how often do we think about what it means to breathe in God's spirit and then to boldly go out beyond our doubts, beyond our fears, into a world beyond the closed doors to proclaim God's love and light to the world?

Maybe that's the idea that amazes me with the natural world. Those crocuses begin pushing up to the sunshine even when they're covered with snow, even when the temperatures seem far from the melting for which we long. I can't yet see the spring, but they believe in it, they trust in that promise with their whole being. And those flowers of spring aren't timid, they bloom with radiant colors and abundant proclamation that they know what we may doubt. Resurrection faith comes in lots of different forms. When I look through eyes of faith I see that invitation to be bold witnesses of beauty and love even when we aren't seeing it yet manifest around us.

We are living in a world where the news speaks of steady incidence of gun violence, of legislation that would readily ban other's rights, whether that's book bans or the steady legislative attacks on the LGBTQ community or expanding our deepening understandings of our nation's complex history with regards to diversity and equity, and who has and hasn't had a place at the table. Fear can silence those who would speak a word of expansive hope and love. And yet God would breathe a spirit of power upon us to get out and bloom with a witness as bold as the risen Christ.

Where are we called to be bold, or even bolder? Is it in the extravagant welcome of our blossoming table fellowship in the community meal? Or how about in those who gather to read "banned books" and engage in discussing them? Or how about as we look to participating in this year's Pride Parade in Milwaukee and look to how we can create safe spaces that proclaim ever more deeply that "all are welcome here," for the love of God knows no bounds!

Our Easter journey is blossoming before us every day! May we each be the boldest bloom of God's love that we can be. Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed...



Peace United Church of Christ Scholarship Fund

The purpose of the Scholarship Fund is to give financial aid and recognition to members of this Church who have shown significant academic and other constructive accomplishments in their school career and church participation.

All members of the Church who, in the opinion of the Committee are qualified and worthy recipients based upon the following criteria are eligible to receive a scholarship:

- Academic achievement
- Service to the Church
- Christian character
- Educational aims

Members may re-apply annually. Applicants may request aid toward the education of their choice beyond High School.

Application forms are available in the Church office or on our website. Applications must be received by **AUGUST 1, 2023.**

Notification of scholarship awards will be made by July 1. The amounts will vary annually. Applicants selected to receive a scholarship shall be expected to remain in continuous attendance in school for the entire semester. **Applicants must submit a transcript of their grades ASAP before February 1, 2024,** following the completion of the first semester, in order to receive their scholarship. Applicants must have successfully completed 12 credits, (full-time student) with no less than a 2.0 grade point average (based on a 4.0 scale).

<u>Habitat Trip</u> – This summer's habitat trip will take place from July 9 – July 14. The group will be traveling to Red Wing, Minnesota and assisting the Goodhue County Habitat for Humanity. The Cost: \$75 for members, \$100 for non-members.

Meeting brought to order at 6pm by Kathy C.

Special welcome and introduction of Vicar Jakob. Very excited and thankful for his arrival.

Special welcome back to Kathy M. Very happy she is feeling better and able to join us.

Approval of Agenda with the addition of talking about Wed services continuing. Motion made by Clark P with a second from Lisa A. Motion approved.

While reviewing the prior month's minutes, it was noted that Chris R last name is spelt Rode. Motion from Clark P to approve the minutes with the changes and a second from Paul B. Motion carried.

Pastor's report submitted with no questions.

New business:

- 1. OCWM contributions: discussion around how other churches donate and how much.
- Guidelines for approving financial requests. Discussed how we go about spending money above and beyond budgeted amounts. Also talked about how the budgeting process works. Kathy C made a motion to approve the ordering of VBS curriculum for \$1900 and a second by Mark B. Motion carried.

- Looking at having a special thank you potluck on May 7 or 21st for the kitchen committee and those who updated the sanctuary with a new video and sound system.
- 3. Discussed the Constitution changes. Request for Bill to send us the final draft and we will then vote in April. Decision made to have a special congregational meeting for the Constitution changes. Upon Council approving a date will be set.
- 4. Thank you for the email votes approving scholarships of \$8200. Each student is getting \$800, and 2 students qualified for additional amounts due to volunteer work at church.

Financial report – Discussed having some fund raising around the kitchen loan. Currently have \$53,500 due. Motion made by Clark P to approve the financial report and submitting for audit with a second by Tim S. Motion carried.
