

THE CALL TO WORSHIP – PSALM 60:1-9

- One: May the peace and grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all.
- Many: And also with you.

Yet we confess that we are often anxious; we do not trust each other as partners in your vision. We are not willing to take the risks and make the hard choices that love requires. Look upon us with kindness and grace. Let your way of peace be made known in our lives and in all the world. Show us how to walk in your paths, through the mercy of our Savior.

All: "Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen."
