

October is **Domestic Violence Awareness Month**

Domestic Violence

Is a pattern of behaviors used by one partner to maintain power and control over another partner in an intimate manner.

Types of Domestic Violence:

- Verbal / Emotional: name calling, threats, yelling, intimidation, isolation, and silent treatment.
- Financial: direct or indirect domination of finances.
- Physical: restraint, slapping, pushing, forcing consumption of or withholding medication, aggravated assault, and
- intentional damage to property. Sexual: forced sexual activity, demeaning sexual names, grabbing, threats of infidelity, and coerced sexual contact.
- Technological: can be used in all forms of abuse



The Cycle of Abuse

There is one constant in abusive relationships: the Cycle of Abuse. Phases of the cycle vary in length of time and severity but continue to

- follow the same pattern. These phases include:
- the calm phase building tension through yelling or criticizing
- exploding with attacks (physical, emotional, or sexual)
- the honeymoon phase (apologiźing, buying gifts, etc.).
