One: God of Peace, we come before you afraid, yet seeking assurance, agitated, yet seeking serenity, angry, yet seeking a forgiving heart:

All: God, we yearn for the peace you promise.

One: Knowing that through Christ all things are made new, we come to this communion table to be recreated through the bread and cup, and to be renewed in our faith and commitment.

All: God, we submit ourselves to renewal through you. This we pray through Jesus the Christ, our Lord and Savior. Amen.

## **Preface & Thanksgiving**

One: Loving and gracious God who summons galaxies into being, we give thanks and blessings to you. We bless you for our world. The diversity of our planet amazes us from the prairies and pampas of the Americas to the dusty deserts of Africa and

Asia, from the majestic mountains of Europe to the vast outback of Australia. We give you thanks for the multiplicity of humanity with our complexity of color and culture yet called into oneness-of-being through Christ. With many tongues, yet with one voice, we honor you singing:

All: "Santo, Santo, Santo" #737

Holy, holy, my heart, my heart adores you.

My heart is glad to say the words:

you are Holy, Lord!

Santo, santo, mi corazon te adora.

One: We remember that on the night he was handed over, while at supper with his friends, he gave us a pledge of love that does away with death.

He took bread, gave thanks for it, broke it, and gave it to the disciples, saying: Take and eat, all of you: This is my body, surrendered for you.

When the supper was over, he took a cup filled with wine, gave thanks for it, and shared it with them, saying: Take and drink, all of you: This is the seal of a new covenant, my poured-out life. I will drink this cup with you again at the table of God's joy in the New Day that is coming. Whenever you do these things, remember me.

One: May this fruit of the vine remind us of the inter-connectedness of people around the world.

## October is omestic Violence Awareness Month

## Domestic Violence

Is a pattern of behaviors used by one partner to maintain power and control over another partner in an intimate manner.

### Types of Domestic Violence:

- Verbal / Emotional: name calling, threats, yelling, intimidation, isolation, and silent treatment.
- Financial: direct or indirect domination of finances.
- Physical: restraint, slapping, pushing, forcing consumption of or withholding medication, aggravated assault, and
- intentional damage to property.
  Sexual: forced sexual activity, demeaning sexual names, grabbing, threats of infidelity, and coerced sexual contact.
- Technological: can be used in all forms of abuse

## The Cycle of Abuse

There is one constant in abusive relationships: the Cycle of Abuse. Phases of the cycle vary in length of time and severity but continue to follow the same pattern. These phases include:

the calm phase

 building tension through yelling or criticizing

 exploding with attacks (physical, emotional, or sexual)

 the honeymoon phase (apologizing, buying gifts, etc.).
