Being Gathered to God – Psalm 90:1-6, 13-17

One: May the peace and grace of our Lord Jesus Christ be with you all.

- Many: And also with you.
- One: Lord, you have been our dwelling place in all generations.
- Many: Before the mountains were brought forth, or ever you had formed the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God.
- One: You turn us back to dust, and say, "Turn back, you mortals." For a thousand years in your sight are like yesterday when it is past, or like a watch in the night.
- Many: You sweep them away; they are like a dream, like grass that is renewed in the morning; in the morning it flourishes and is renewed; in the evening it fades and withers.
- One: Turn, O LORD!
- Many: How long?
- One: Have compassion on your servants!
- Many: Satisfy us in the morning with your steadfast love, so that we may rejoice and be glad all our days.
- One: Make us glad as many days as you have afflicted us, and as many years as we have seen evil.
- Many: Let your work be manifest to your servants, and your glorious power to their children. Let the favor of the Lord our God be upon us, and prosper for us the work of our hands— O prosper the work of our hands!

Confessing and Receiving Forgiveness

- One: Let us join in confessing our sins.
- All: Merciful God, we stand before your radiant light knowing that we have not been fully faithful to you. You ask us to offer

you our whole heart, our whole mind, our whole soul, and yet so often we only commit a little part of ourselves to you. Beloved God, we have not fully loved You, nor have we fully accepted the depths of Your love and care for us. As we struggle with our own love, we fall short of fully loving our neighbors as ourselves. Have mercy on us, forgive us, renew us, and lead us in your ways with that perfect love which casts out all fear. Together we pray as Jesus taught us: "Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory, forever. Amen."
