

Worship at Peace Church

Updates from the Regathering Committee:

As a committee we agreed that we will continue following the guidelines of the CDC, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, while using the local data generated by the County Health Department. Following these guidelines we can expand our activities to 50% of capacity! (100 worshippers in the sanctuary, the worship leaders are in addition to that number).

The new CDC guidance on masks removes all restrictions for those who are vaccinated.

For people who are <u>unvaccinated</u>, per CDC guidelines, masks are required over the mouth and nose at all times, and social distancing of 6 feet remains.
