Worship at Peace Church

Updates from the Regathering Committee:

As a committee we agreed that we will continue following the guidelines of the CDC, the Wisconsin Department of Health Services, while using the local data generated by the County Health Department. Following these guidelines and our current County Covid cases our capacity is going backwards! At this time we should be limiting our attendance again to 25% of capacity! (about 50 worshippers in the sanctuary, the worship leaders are in addition to that number). During the summer we have been sitting close to this number. This is a bold reminder for all of us to do our part and consider how we not only keep ourselves safe, but also our neighbors and especially the most vulnerable among us. If each of us do our small part then we will more quickly and safely return to normal!

For people who are <u>unvaccinated</u>, per CDC guidelines, masks are <u>required</u> over the mouth and nose at all times, and social distancing of 6 feet remains.

If you are <u>vaccinated</u>, per CDC guidelines, in order to maximize protection from the Delta variant and prevent possibly spreading it to others, the CDC <u>recommends</u> wearing a mask indoors in public if you are in an area of substantial or high transmission. Currently, Washington County falls into that category. Masks are available at all entrances.

<u>Lectionary group at Peace Church</u> Each week we gather together to study the scripture for the upcoming Sunday. The group meets Tuesday mornings at 10:00 a.m. in Fellowship Hall.

Saturday, March 5, 2022 at 3:00 p.m.


